Slippery Rock Township Supervisors Minutes for: 4/9/2018

Chairman, Paul Dickey called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. In attendance were Supervisors Terry Doerr and John Hines along with Rick Grossman, planning consultant plus Engineer, David Neill. Twelve members of the public attended.

Approval of Minutes / Payment of Bills / Financial Reports

John Hines made a motion to approve the minutes from March 26, 2018 regular meeting, approve and pay the bills plus approve the financial report. Terry Doerr seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

Open Comment(s)

SR Park Civic Association –drainage. Janet Powell, president of the SR Park Civic Association was present along with other members and neighbors to discuss drainage along Mohawk Trail and Golf View Drive. Discussion ensued. Paul Dickey agreed to arrange a meeting with Janet Powell and the Township Engineer to visit the site and review the drainage issue further. The office will coordinate the meeting.

Engineer's Report - David Neill

Kiester Road

Estimate #7 has been submitted for approval. This includes payment of the pedestrian crossing signals, topsoil placement and the remainder of the surveying. PennDOT will need to modify the estimate as it still has liquidated damages on it. The LDs stopped on 12/7/17. EADS met with PennDOT and East Coast Paving on March 26, 2018 to discuss ECPs time extension request and quantities. ECP still has to provide information to PennDOT and EADS. From the meeting 20 days are being proposed to be added to the project. EADS recommends providing the 20 additional days. Discussion ensued.

Right of Ways

To date no information has been provided to EADS from the solicitor on the outstanding easements/right of ways.

Etna Road

Butler County is coordinating the award of the project with Youngblood Paving. They were low bidder on the project at \$60,730.00. David reported that the bid was less than the estimate money and the board agreed to move that money to the next CDBG project. Discussion ensued and no action needed.

Sewer Connection to SRU

We are awaiting the approved right of way from SRU. We will soon be scheduling the surveying for the design of the project. It will require a HOP. Paul Dickey added that he believes that the SR Municipal Water Authority will be reviewing the agreement at their meeting on April 10th.

Planner's Report - Rick Grossman

- 1. SR Fire 911 Radio system update. Rick Grossman presented the board with some information in regards to the SR Fire Department needs. Discussion ensued and no action taken at this time.
- Flood Plain town hall meeting set date. The board authorized Rick Grossman to handle the information meeting and set the date for May 14, 2018 from 4PM - 6PM at the Slippery Rock Township Community Room.
- 3. Ordinances for consideration Rick Grossman/Wil White
 - a. Chapter 13 peddler definition.
 - b. Chapter 4 Fire Insurance Escrow
 - c. Chapter 21- Sidewalk Maintenance

d. Chapter 8 Floodplain ordinance and modification. Rick sent final draft to the Floodplain FEMA consultant and DCED and noted a discrepancy on accessory buildings. Rick Reported that SRPC recommended at their meeting earlier this evening to allow accessory structures in the floodplain area up to 600 sq. ft. with determination by variance, which would be determined by the ZHB. Discussion ensued. The Board agreed with the SRPC recommendation and Rick will incorporate in the last draft. Rick noted that August 2nd is when this Ordinance has to be in effect.

Paul Dickey made a motion to set a public hearing on May 29, 2018 at 2:30 p.m. for the following ordinances: Chapter 13-Peddler Definition, Chapter 4-Fire Insurance Escrow, Chapter 21-Sidewalk Maintenance, Chapter 8-Floodplain Ordinance. John Hines seconded and the motion carried unanimously.

- e. <u>Chapter 18</u> 10 acre exemption and holding tank. Rick discussed this ordinance with the board and it was agreed to forward this ordinance to SRPC for further review. Paul Dickey would like to review the SEO recommendations to the holding tank and our existing ordinance; Rick will forward this information.
- 4. Report of animal abuse. Rick reported complaint about garbage and chickens. Rick addressed the garbage issue and turned over the chicken issue to the human officer; he believes if we had a good nuisance ordinance that covers livestock it could be addressed locally. Discussion ensued and noted that solicitor, Wil White is reviewing the proposed Nuisance Ordinance and the chicken issue would be addressed accordingly.

Unfinished Business

- One Voice Abused Domestic Animals (OVADA) donation. Discussion ensued. It was agreed to delay any action and get more information before any decision is made.
- Community Room insulation. Discussion ensued.

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Paul Dickey made a motion to accept the quote from Unique Stone Construction, Inc. for the R-30 blown fiber at the cost of \$3,875.00 for insulation blown in over existing insulation to fill void where new lights were installed, which includes labor. John Hines seconded and the motion carried unanimously.
